authorized by the Charter School Institute.



Public School: A tuition-free school funded by the Colorado Department of Education.

Charter School: A publicly funded independent school established by teachers, parents, or community groups under the terms of a charter with a local or national authority. Charter schools are free to pursue a unique mission (Early College Model High School).



A CSI School: Authorized by the Charter School Institute, an independent agency of the Colorado Department of Education (the only independent, statewide charter school authorizer in Colorado).

THE EARLY COLLEGE MODEL

High school with a concurrent enrollment program ≠ Early College Model High School

"Early College" means a secondary school that provides only a curriculum that is designed in a manner that ensures that a student who successfully completes the curriculum will have completed either an associate degree, sixty credits or a postsecondary credential (starting 2021-2022).

CONCURRENT

Concurrent enrollment: enrolled in a traditional high school and takes college classes (an option)

EARLY COLLEGE

Early college model: take high school classes in preparation for full college workloads. Students have fewer high school classes because they are replaced by college classes (a focus)



College cost has surged 726% since 1984

Student debt has quintupled since 2004


FULL-TIME vs. PART-TIME


