Safe2Tell Presentations

Sign up for a Safe2Tell presentation for the beginning of next school year! August and September fill up quickly. Presentations are offered virtually and in-person based on location and availability.

The presentation is about 25 minutes long. It answers the following 4 questions:

1. What can I report to Safe2Tell?
2. How does Safe2Tell work?
3. Is Safe2Tell anonymous?
4. Is Safe2Tell working?

Safe2Tell emphasizes the importance of talking to a trusted adult about safety concerns first. Safe2Tell is option 2 or the backup plan for when a trusted adult might not be available. We also talk about breaking the code of silence and the idea of "See something, say something." The presentation shares data from our annual report and highlights the fact that 95% of reports to Safe2Tell are valid and an outcome results. The presentation ends with some sample reports and a true/false section at the end to check for understanding of key concepts.
