WHAT IS CHILDFIND?

ChildFind is a continuous effort by the Colorado Department of Education, Charter School Institute and Colorado Early Colleges to locate any student with any manner of disabilities from age 3 to age 21, even if those students are enrolled in college courses, and even in students are enrolled in online, off-campus courses. Services are provided at no cost to the student or family.

WHO DO I TALK TO IF I BELIEVE I OR MY STUDENT MAY HAVE A DISABILITY?

Anyone can make a referral for a student who they believe may be struggling with an undiagnosed disability. If a student is found eligible, a parent or legal guardian will need to consent for services unless the student has legal education rights over themselves.
