



Administration of Medical Marijuana

The Colorado Early Colleges' (CEC) Governing Board (Board) strives to honor families' private medical decisions while ensuring a learning environment free of disruption. As a result, the Board prohibits the administration of Medical Marijuana unless its administration cannot reasonably be accomplished outside of school hours.

NO CEC EMPLOYEE OR STUDENT MAY ADMINISTOR OR POSSESS MARIJUANA OR MARIJUANA DERIVATIVES WITH THC IN ANY FORM ON CEC PROPERTY, WHILE RIDING A CEC SCHOOL BUS, OR WHILE AT CEC SPONSORED EVENTS.

Administration of Medical Marijuana to Qualified Students shall be in accordance with this policy. This policy does not apply to the administration of any other prescription or nonprescription medications, which shall be governed in accordance with CEC's Medication Administration policy and applicable laws.

Definitions

For purposes of this policy, the following definitions shall apply:

- "Designated Location" means a location on CEC school grounds that is identified in writing by a CEC Head of School/Principal or Chief Executive Administrator (CEA). The Board's preference for a Designated Location is the School Nurse/medical office. Other locations shall only be approved as a Designated Location by the CEA in writing due to unavailability or accessibility of the nurse/medical office.
- "Medical Marijuana" means a cannabis product with a delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) concentration greater than 0.3 percent prescribed by a Medical Professional.
- "Medical Professional" means an individual licensed under article 36 or article 38 of title 12 of the Colorado Revised Statutes who has prescriptive authority.
- "Permissible Form of Medical Marijuana Products" means non-inhalable (smoke or vapor) products such as oils, tinctures, edible products, or lotions that can be administered and fully ingested or absorbed in a short period of time and are not intended for recreational use. Patches or other forms of administration that continue to deliver Medical Marijuana products to a student while at school may be appropriate for students who receive on-going adult assistance or on a case-by-case basis as determined by the school when adequate protections against misuse may be made. Forms of Medical Marijuana products not included in this definition may be proposed by the Qualified Student's parent or legal guardian to the CEA, or CEA's designee, who may authorize such a request after consultation with appropriate medical personnel chosen by CEC.

- “Qualified Student” means a student enrolled at CEC, who holds a valid Registry identification card (as defined in Article XVIII, Section 14 of the Colorado Constitution “Registry Card”) *and has a signed and notarized “Written Plan: Administration of Medical Marijuana to Qualified Students”* on file with the CEC school, and for whom the administration of Medical Marijuana products cannot reasonably be accomplished outside of school hours.
- “Primary Caregiver” means a person who must be over the age of 18. In no event shall the Qualified Student or any another CEC student be recognized as a Primary Caregiver. Any Primary Caregiver seeking access to school property, a CEC school bus, or CEC school-sponsored event for purposes of this policy must comply with CEC’s School Visitors policy and all other applicable CEC policies.
- “Universal Symbol” means the image established by the Colorado Marijuana Enforcement Division and made available to Licensees through the Marijuana Enforcement Division’s website indicating the Medical Marijuana or Medical Marijuana Infused-Product contains marijuana.

Permissible Administration of Medical Marijuana Products to a Qualified Student:

A Primary Caregiver may administer Permissible Forms of Medical Marijuana products to a Qualified Student on school grounds, upon a school bus, or at a school-sponsored event only if the following criteria are met:

- The Qualified Student’s parent/guardian (hereinafter, “Parent”) provides the applicable CEC school with a copy of the student’s valid Colorado Registry card which authorizes the student to receive Medical Marijuana at least one week in advance of requesting authorization to administer Medical Marijuana pursuant to this policy.
- The Parent must provide the applicable CEC school with the signed and notarized “Written Plan: Administration of Medical Marijuana to Qualified Students describing:
 - the valid registration for the State of Colorado for the use of Medical Marijuana,
 - the Medical Marijuana product and dose prescribed,
 - copy of physician certification,
 - the side effects of the product,
 - the reason the product is necessary for the Qualified Student,
 - the specified time and frequency of administration,
 - name, DOB, and copy of identification of all requested persons (caregiver names) to administer listed on the Medical Marijuana Registry Card,
 - a statement that the Medical Marijuana product cannot be administered exclusively outside of school hours, and
 - an explanation of why the Medical Marijuana product cannot be administered exclusively outside of school hours.
- The Primary Caregiver shall be responsible for providing the Permissible Form of Medical Marijuana to be administered to the Qualified Student.
- Within ten (10) school days the school administration will notify the parents of acceptance or denial of the request. CEC may determine, at its sole discretion, whether a location or method of administration of Medical Marijuana products is available that does not create a disruption to the learning environment or cause exposure to other students. CEC may also determine, at its sole discretion, whether the continued use of the Medical Marijuana product disrupts the learning environment or causes exposure to other students. If CEC

determines that the Medical Marijuana product creates a disruption or causes exposure, CEC shall consider alternative arrangements.

- If accepted, CEC shall approve the written plan. The Written Plan shall be signed by the Head of School for the student's CEC school, the Qualified Student's Parent, and the Primary Caregiver.
- If at any time dosage amounts or times must change, the parent/guardian must request to alter/revise the Written Plan prior to implementing changes.

Additional Parameters

- This policy is not intended to and does not convey any right to any student, parent, or medical professional to demand access to any general or particular location on school grounds to administer Medical Marijuana products.
- Student possession, use, distribution, sale, or being under the influence of Medical Marijuana products inconsistent with this policy may be considered a violation of CEC's Drug, Alcohol, and Tobacco Use policy concerning drug and alcohol involvement by students or other applicable CEC policy and may subject the student to disciplinary action, including suspension and/or expulsion
- Permission to administer Medical Marijuana to a Qualified Student may be limited or revoked if the Qualified Student, Parent, and/or the Primary Caregiver violates this policy or demonstrates an inability to follow this policy's parameters responsibly.
- All Medical Marijuana brought onto CEC property or to CEC school-sponsored events must be kept in packaging that contains the Universal Symbol and may only be removed from the packaging while in the Designated Location. School personnel shall not administer, hold, or store any Medical Marijuana products in any form.
- Medical Marijuana cannot be given by a Registered Nurse, even if approved by the State, per the Nurse Practice Act.
- If the federal government indicates that CEC's federal funds are jeopardized by this policy, the Board declares that this policy shall be suspended immediately and that the administration of any form of Medical Marijuana to Qualified Students on school property, while riding a CEC school bus, or at a CEC school-sponsored event shall not be permitted. In such instance, CEC shall post notice of such policy suspension and prohibition on its website.

_____ I understand that permission to administer Medical Marijuana in accordance with this plan may be revoked for the failure to comply with the Board's policy on the administration of Medical Marijuana to Qualified Students or other applicable Board policies.

_____ The Primary Caregiver is qualified to perform the task of administering the Medical Marijuana product(s) designated herein to the Qualified Student.

_____ I understand that Medical Marijuana may only be administered in the Designated Location.

_____ I understand that Medical Marijuana brought onto CEC property or to CEC events must kept in packaging that contains the Universal Symbol and may only be removed from the packaging while in the Designated Location.
