- ☐ Student agrees to be responsible for and to supervise and care for the service animal independently, including any feeding, exercising, walking to relieve, clean up and stain removal.
- ☐ Student must be able to and agrees to harness, leash, and/or tether the dog as needed at all times, ensuring the service animal does not approach other students or staff.
- ☐ Student must be able to and agrees to keep the service animal's vaccinations up to date at all times. This includes DHLPPC (Distemper, Hepatitis, Leptospirosis, Parainfluenza, Parvovirus, Coronavirus), Bordetella, Rabies, and other vaccines required by the veterinarian. Attach a copy of the service animal's vaccine record to this form.
- ☐ Student must be able to and agrees to keep the service animal treated for and kept free of fleas and ticks.
- ☐ Student must be able to and agrees to keep the service animal clean and groomed to avoid shedding and dander so allergy issues and risks to other students and staff are minimized (due to severe allergies to animal dander). Student understands that allowing the service animal to make contact, even with permission, with staff and students increases the likelihood of allergic exposure and reaction to others and is not permitted at any time.
- ☐ Student agrees to keep the service animal on a harness, leash, or other tether unless student is unable to do this because of a disability or because the use of a harness, leash, or other tether would interfere with the service animal's safe and effective performance of work or tasks. In that case, the service animal needs to be under student's control (voice control, signals, or other effective means). If student cannot keep the service animal on a harness, leash, or other tether,

please explain why student is unable to and how being leashed interferes with the dog's performance of the specified task for which the dog has been trained.

- ☐ Student agrees that service animals must not be disruptive or active in any classroom, cafeteria, gymnasium, or assembly situation, including, but not limited to barking, whining, licking, soliciting petting or touch, etc.
- ☐ Student understands and agrees CEC will need to exclude the service animal from CEC facilities, vehicles, grounds, or functions under the following circumstances:
- Service animal is out of control and student, or animal's handler, does not take effective and immediate action to control the service animal.
 - Service animal is not housebroken.
 - Service animal poses a direct threat to the health and/or safety of others.
 - For any other reasons that may arise and are permitted by law.

Lastly, the owner or the handler of a service animal is liable for any and all damages to property or injuries to persons caused by the service animal. The owner or the handler of a service animal must also indemnify, defend, and hold harmless CEC from and against any and all claims, actions, suits, judgments, and demands brought by any party arising on account of, or in connection with, any activity of, or damage or injury caused by the service animal.

CEC staff cannot take responsibility for the care and/or management of service animals.
